Present Continuous Tense—Yes-No Questions and Short Answers

Ask Yes-No questions in the present continuous tense to ask if something is happening right now.

To make a Yes-No question with the present continuous tense, put the **BE** part of the verb first.

Statement: I am dancing.

Yes-No Question: Am I dancing?

Questions	Short Answers	
	Affirmative (No Contraction)	Negative
Am I dancing?	Yes, you are.	No, you aren't. No, you're not.
Are you going home?	Yes, I am. Yes, we are.	--- No, we aren't. No, we're not.
Is he sleeping?	Yes, he is.	No, he isn't. No, he's not.
Is she driving?	Yes, she is.	No, she isn't. No, she's not.
Is it raining?	Yes, it is.	No, it isn't. No, it's not.
Are we making noise?	Yes, we are. Yes, you are.	No, we aren't. No, you aren't. No, we're not. No, you're not.
Are they wearing jeans?	Yes, they are.	No, they aren't. No, they're not.

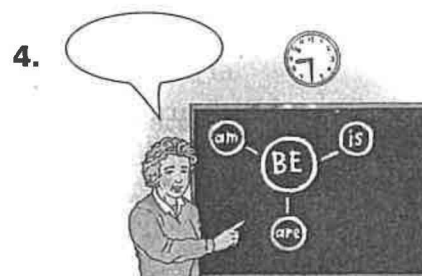
