## 2 Grammar connections: *and ... too, and ... either, and but*

Use *and ... too, and ... either, and but* to show agreement or difference.

### AND ... TOO

Use *and ... too* to show agreement with affirmative sentences.

David likes sports, **and** Kyle likes sports, **too**.  
David likes sports, **and** Kyle does, **too**.

### AND ... EITHER

Use *and ... either* to show agreement with negative sentences.

David doesn't wear glasses, **and** Kyle doesn't wear glasses **either**.  
David doesn't wear glasses, **and** Kyle doesn't **either**.

### BUT

Use *but* to show a difference.

Elsa wears glasses, **but** David doesn't wear glasses.  
Elsa wears glasses, **but** David doesn't.
