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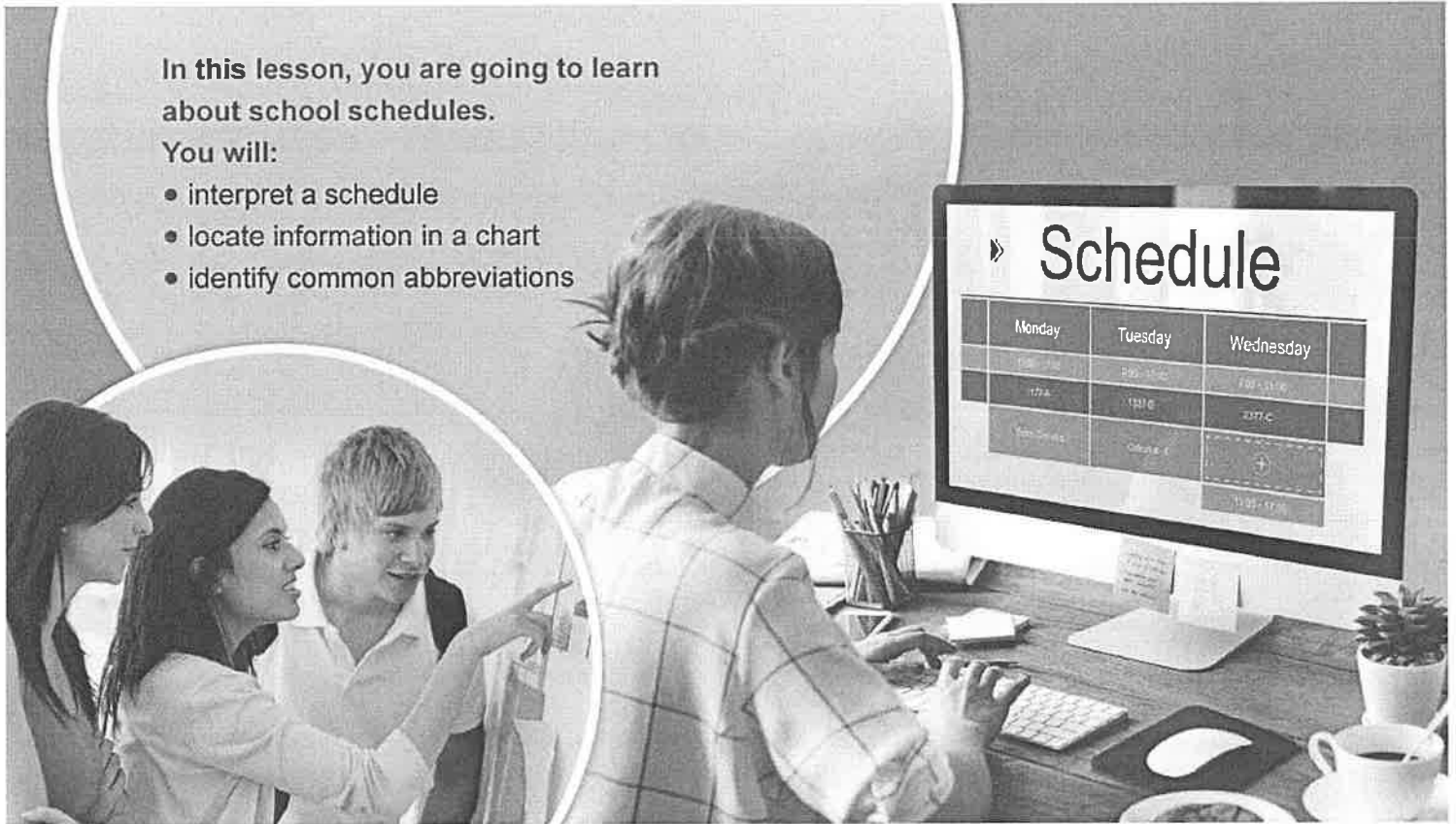

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**▼ Days of the Week**

In schedules, the days of the week are often abbreviations. For example, *M* is Monday. *T-F* means Tuesday through Friday.

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**▼ Titles**

We often use a title before a last name. Men use *Mr.* and women use *Ms.* Some married women use *Mrs.*
